Farm School

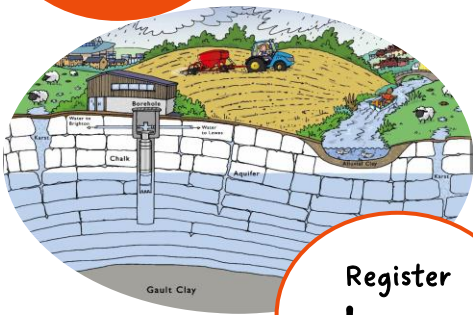


Our City , Our World and Farm School are teaming up to run a series of interactive webinars around farming, nature and sustainability.
